Kenya's boundless wilderness and big game has long attracted adventure seekers from all over the world. Kenya boasts of an incredible range of landscapes, unique geographical features and incredible wildlife species. Adapted from Karen Blixen's classic book, the film told the story of her life in colonial Kenya, with Meryl Streep in the lead role and Robert Redford playing her lover, Denys Finch Hatton. With stunning cinematography and a rich music score by John Barry, the film brought Kenya to life for audiences all over the world. A major box office hit, Out of Africa went on to win the Academy Award for Best Picture.

The 2005 box-office hit "The Constant Gardener" was also filmed on location in Loiyangalani, a small town located on the southeastern coast of Lake Turkana. Kenya is a great destination for television wildlife productions. Many award winning wildlife series have been shot on location in Kenya by BBC Natural History, Discovery, Survival and other production houses. The Maasai Mara continues to be the backdrop for BBC's popular Big Cat Diary, following the lives of the reserves predators.

Ultimate Kenya Migration Safari takes place in some of these places featured in the movies and places that have been graced by dignitaries the likes of President Roosevelt in 1909 and the Royals, most currently the engagement of Prince William and Kate Middleton while on safari in Kenya.

Day 1, September 16, 2012 Sunday: USA/London.. Depart on an overnight Virgin Atlantic Airways to London, England.

Day 2, September 17, Monday: London/Nairobi... Arrive London Heathrow Airport in the morning. In the evening board Kenya Airways overnight flight to Nairobi. *(Note: The layover at the airport may be long, thus may need a hotel dayroom to rest. Or you may opt to go to London a day earlier and overnight. To Africa Tours and Safaris can assist you with hotel reservations in London)*

Day 3, September 18, Tuesday: Arrive Nairobi... Arrive Nairobi in the morning. Arrive Nairobi in the morning. In the late afternoon you first game drive in the conservancy. After the game drive return to the camp for dinner. There is an optional night game drive (extra cost) after dinner. **(Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Diner)**

Day 5, September 20, Thursday: Fairmont Mount Kenya Safari Club

After breakfast drive to Fairmont Mount Kenya Safari Club. Rest of the day at your leisure to enjoy the club's various facilities. There are many recreational activities available: horseback riding, golf, croquet, a putting green, a bowling green, table tennis, swimming, a beauty salon, an animal orphanage.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Accommodation: Mount Kenya Safari Club Fairmont Hotel ...Built in 1959 as the private retreat of movie star William Holden, the Safari Club has near-legendary status and is now in the hands of the Fairmont hotel group. The sprawling, resort like hotel is right on Mount Kenya's doorstep, with majestic views of its peaks and quick access to its scenic national park. Upon arrival, you walk along the equator right on your way to the check-in desk. There are 100 acres of immaculately tended gardens spread on either side of the equator.

Day 6, September 21, Friday: Samburu Game Reserve ...

After breakfast drive further north to the semi-arid and rugged landscape of Samburu National Reserve (137 miles). Samburu takes its name from the nomadic tribe who live throughout this area. Shaba and Buffalo springs are also Samburu land. The Samburu have long used the waters of the Ewaso N'giro as a water source for their herds of goats, sheep and camels. In dry periods, they dig wells into the dry river bed, or take advantage of readymade wells dug by elephants. Traditionally the Samburu hold great respect for the wild animals with which they share this area. Optional visit to the Samburu village for cultural experience can be arranged.

Safari through Samburu, Buffalo Springs and Shaba is a rich and rewarding experience. Travelling along the banks of the Ewaso N'giro provides a fascinating procession of varied species. Elephants come to the river to drink, and in the dry season, use their tusks to dig deep wells in the dry river beds. These elephant excavations then become a focal point for other plains game and troops of baboon, attracted by the fresh water supply. There are plenty of crocodiles here, and large specimens can be seen sunning themselves on sandbanks. The heavy traffic of game around the riverbanks means that Lions are commonly seen hunting here. The plains and surrounding hills are also well worth exploring, and are the best place to find gerenuk, Grevy's Zebra and cheetah. The rocky slopes of the Kopjes and hills are good country for Kudu and are home to several prides of lion. Most of the lodges and camps here are situated on the river bank, and there is good game viewing from these properties.

Meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner

Accommodation: Ashnil Samburu Camp ...Ashnil Samburu Camp sits in Buffalo Springs Game Reserve which takes its name from an oasis of crystal clear water at the western end of the reserve. It is separated from Samburu National Reserve by Ewaso Nyiro River and is less hilly and dense yet equally very attractive. There are a total number of 24 deluxe en-suite tents. Each of the exclusive comfortable deluxe tents gives perfect view of the Ewaso Nyiro River, surrounding beautiful landscape and all lives this brown river supports. Every spacious tent consists of a dressing area, sitting area, luggage rack and en-suite facilities to provide a memorable stay close to nature. The open sitting restaurant located in the main building, overlooks the Ewaso Nyiro River. There is a variety of menus to choose from but mainly oriental, international cuisine and a taste of African traditional dishes.

Day 7, September 22, Saturday: Samburu Game Reserve

Early morning and late afternoon game-drives enable you to see wildlife unique to this arid yet beautiful part of Kenya. Optional activities include: guided nature walks and visit to samburu villages. **Meal: breakfast, Lunch, dinner**

The airlines requires tickets to be issued upon reservation and confirmation. Once the tickets are issued cancellation penalty will apply. Day 8, September 23, Sunday: Masai Mara Game Reserve After and early morning game drive and breakfast you will say “kwaheri” (goodbye) to your driver/guide and board a light aircraft for your flight to Masai Mara National Reserve (*there is luggage restriction on this flight – 33 pounds. You will leave your extra luggage with your driver guide to take it back to Nairobi and you will retrieve it when you return to Nairobi from Masai Mara*). On arrival at the airstrip met you will be met by the driver/guide from the Fairmont Mara Safari Club. Arrive in time for lunch. In the late afternoon proceed on a game-drive through one of the world’s greatest game reserves. Masai Mara is an extension of the great Serengeti plains. The Mara has been called the Kingdom of Lions and these regal and powerful hunters dominate these grasslands. Cheetahs are also a common sight in the Mara, as are Hyena and smaller predators such as Jackals. It is the land of “Big-Six “ (lions, hippo, rhino, elephants and buffalo and cheetah). The Mara is an awesome natural wonder, a place where Maasai warriors share the plains with hunting lions, a place of mighty herds and timeless cycles of life, death and regeneration. Wildlife moves freely in and out of the reserve, and through neighboring Maasai lands. This unique co-existence of man and wildlife makes this Maasai land one of the world’s most unique wilderness regions. The Maasai regard themselves not just as residents of this area but that they are as much a part of the life of the land as the land is part of their lives. **Meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner**

Accommodation: Mara Safari ClubSurrounded on three sides by the Mara River, and on the edge of the world’s Seventh “New” Wonder of the World – the Masai Mara - Fairmont Mara Safari Club is the epitome of tented luxury. The main lodge at the center of camp hosts an indoor restaurant, bar and library with Internet access to keep the relatives up to date with safari adventures. A spacious outside deck overhangs the river and leads to a heated pool, complete with bar and private massage tents. With four poster, pillow-top beds and a veranda overlooking the hippo and crocodile-filled river, each of the tents at Fairmont Mara Safari Club is superbly furnished with its own private, three-piece bathroom, including a number of “outdoor showers” in select tents. Each tent consists of heavy canvas sides and roof mounted to a concrete foundation. Like most tents, you enter and exit through a zippered slit on the front of the tent. Each tent also has a large front porch with a view of the Mara River where hippos and crocs tend to hang out and wallow in the muddy waters. While the tents look pretty plain from the outside, once inside they reveal all the comforts of a 5-star hotel including a roomy walk-in shower, separate toilet room, vanity and plush towels. The queen-sized bed was very comfortable with nice down pillows. There is even a mini-bar/refrigerator inside a beautiful leather covered trunk.

Outdoor dining is enhanced with the creation of a boma, a structure influenced by traditional homesteads, where guests can enjoy a cultural dinner.

Day 9/10,September 24/25, Monday/Tuesday: Masai Game Reserve

Spend 2 full days in Mara. Awaken to the sounds of birds in these endless rolling plains dotted with acacia trees. The scheduled morning and afternoon game drives provide you with an excellent opportunity to photograph the abundant wildlife in this seemingly limitless game reserve. On one of the morning you may opt to go on the scheduled game drive or for optional an early morning hot air balloon safari (extra cost -\$470.00 per person). The balloon ride gives you a bird’s eye view of the Mara plains before landing for a champagne breakfast in the bush. For your game drive you depart from the lobby each morning at 6:30 am. Afternoon game drives depart at 3:30 pm. Game drives usually last 3 to 4 hours. In the mornings, you will return back in time for breakfast and in the evening, you will be back in time for dinner. **Meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner**
Accommodation: Mara Safari Luxury Tented Camp

Vaccination.....The following vaccinations are recommended: Tetanus, typhoid, polio, Hepatitis A&B; consult your doctor or local health department, travel clinic or immunization center about any vaccinations you may need to update Anti-malaria medication.

Day 11, September 26, Wednesday: Nairobi/London

After an early morning game drive, you will be transferred to the airstrip for a scheduled flight to Nairobi (maximum baggage allowance 33 pounds) the flight is approximately 1 hour. On arrival at Wilson Airport, you will be met by To Africa Tours and Safaris representative and you will be transferred to Carnivore restaurant for Lunch. After lunch visit Kazuri Beads Factory situated on what was once a part of Karen von Blixen's coffee plantation. The mission of Kazuri is to provide and sustain employment opportunities for disadvantaged members of Kenyan society, women. The Kazuri employs over 370 women, mostly single mothers. It is equipped with a Clinic, providing free medical care for the employees and their immediate family. Kazuri also absorbs 80% of the medical bills outside the Factory Clinic. The women make ceramic jewelry and beads. It is painstaking work. Many of the beads and necklace components are tiny. Each one has to be shaped carefully, polished, fired, painted and fired again. The result is "KAZURI", the Swahili word for "small and beautiful." This project was started in 1975, today Kazuri jewelry is sold all over the world! Your next stop is at Karen Blixen Museum. The Karen Blixen house meets three of the customary criteria for historical significance. First, it is associated with the broad historical pattern of European settlement and cultivation of East Africa. Second, it is associated with the life of a person significant to our past as the home of Baroness Karen Blixen from 1917 -1931. As such, it served as the setting and basis of her well known book Out of Africa, written under the pseudonym Isak Dinesen and as a gathering place for other well known personalities of the period. Third, the building embodies the distinctive characteristics of its type, period and method of construction. The house's architecture is typical of late 19th century bungalow architecture, including the spacious rooms, horizontal layout verandas, tile roof and stone construction typical of scores of residences built throughout European suburbs of Nairobi in early decades.

After the visit to the museum, proceed to the hotel to freshen up for your last dinner in Kenya, followed by a transfer to the airport for your Kenya Airways flight to London. **Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner**
Hotel Dayroom: Fairmont The Norfolk Hotel

Day 12, September 27, Thursday: London/USA ... Arrive London in the morning and connect your Virgin Atlantic Airways flight to USA, taking all the memories of Kenya to share with friends and family.

USEFUL INFORMATION FOR TRAVEL TO KENYA

MONEY MATTERS:

The official Kenya currency is Kenya Shilling. The written abbreviation is either KSh or using /= after the amount (500/=). Available in notes re 50, 100, 200, 500, 1000 shillings. Available coins are 1, 5, 10, 20, 50.

Foreign currencies such as the USD, Euros and Sterling pound are widely accepted. However, please note that dollar bills printed before **2003** are not accepted in Kenya, as there was a large amount of illegal processing of dollar bills in the country during that time. High denomination notes may also not be accepted, so make sure that your money in small bills (\$1s, \$5s \$10s, and \$20s) and make sure they notes are new bills. The bills should not be worn out or torn.

Foreign exchange and ATMs are found throughout Kenya's major city centers and shopping complexes. It is advised that you bring enough money to last you the duration of your trip. Although the dollar is accepted widely, large cities and lodges/camps, you can exchange some of your money into local currency at the bank at the airport on arrival or bureau de change. Some hotels/lodges/camp, will exchange the money, however you will not get a good rate.

Visa, MasterCard, Diners Club and American Express are accepted by most restaurants, shops and hotels. Proof of identity may be requested, so be sure to carry a passport or some form of photo identification at all times. It is difficult to pay by credit card outside Nairobi.

The recommended amount of money to bring in cash is between \$500—\$800.00 minimum in U.S dollars. This money should include your tips and gratuities. In hotels/Lodges/Camps you can leave U.S. dollars or Kenya Shilling.

ELECTRICITY

The electricity supply in Kenya is 220/240 v 50hz. Plugs are 3 point square. You will need to bring your own converter and adapter (universal adapter with square three prongs) for recharging camera batteries, hairdryers, and electric shavers. Or instead you can bring devices that use batteries to operate and a supply of batteries.

WHAT TO BRING

When packing keep in mind on international flights you are allowed one check-in luggage weighing 50 pounds. Your carry-on luggage only maximum of 13 pounds. On inter-park flights on safari you are allowed 33 pounds. Also while on safari the space in the vehicles is limited. It is recommended you use soft sided luggage /duffel bag with wheels which is easier to transport in safari vehicles and on inter-park flights. It is also advisable, in addition to your check-in luggage to bring a small carry-on bag with everything that is essential and valuable, such as camera equipment, you medications, important travel documents, passports, money etc. for more information and regulations regarding contents of carry-on luggage please visit this website <http://www.tsa.gov/travelers>.

Safaris are extremely informal vacations, so park lightly. All the lodges allow casual clothing and traditional safari wear while dining. It is recommended you bring light weight comfortable washable clothes. Most lodges and camps will launder your clothes for free or a small fee (\$2 - \$3 per item) within 24-hours. Loose fitting, casual and comfortable clothing is recommended. Bright colors are not suitable for game viewing, and game drives are conducted in the early morning and late afternoon, which can be cold, especially in winter. Light cotton trousers or shorts and shirts (both long and short sleeved), comfortable walking shoes, windbreaker, sunhat.

The following is a suggested packing list

- 1 pair of sandals or flip-flops
- 2-3 Casual, comfortable and loose fitting clothing in khaki, brown, beige, green and olive colors made of natural fabrics such as cotton
- 2-3 T-shirts and light tops
- 2-3 Long-sleeved shirts/blouses
- 2 pairs of shorts or 2-3 pairs light weight long pants that zip off for shorts
- 1 warm fleece or sweater
- 1 Swimsuit/bathing suite
- Cotton socks and underwear
- Pajamas/Sleepwear
- Hat and bandana
- Optional: lightweight jacket or windbreaker

Other Items

- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Small flashlight
- Sunglasses, sunscreen and lip balm
- Insect repellent
- Contact lens solution, spare glasses and extra contact lenses, if applicable
- Money belt or waist pack for money, tickets and passport

KENYA VISA FOR U.S. CITIZENS

All citizens require a current passport and a return ticket to Kenya. Bring your camera and extra batteries, extra film, extra camera batteries, extra camera lenses, extra camera accessories, postcard, binoculars, etc. or lightweight camera vest

- Waterless anti-bacterial gel, hand wipes and Kleenex
- Camera, plenty of film, extra batteries and charger, if applicable

- Journal or notebook for recording daily observations and pens

Visa Requirements:

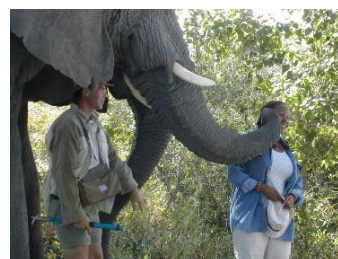

4. Completed (Filled in) Application Form duly signed.
5. Copy of flight Itinerary/Letter from travel agent on company letterhead confirming booking.
6. Two Passport size photos (NB: Computer generated pictures are not acceptable)
7. Pre-paid self-addressed s return courier envelope for Fedex, Express Mail, Certified Mail or Priority Mail with delivery confirmation (Note: UPS, Metered stamps and Regular mail are not acceptable).
8. Please ensure that all your paperwork is well organized (i.e. photo stapled at the top left side of Application form, while your itinerary and application form are together
